

Grand Canyon Wolf Recovery Project accomplishments in 2012:

- Hosted the Wild and Scenic Film Festival on tour in Flagstaff, AZ for an audience of nearly 300 people. This was our biggest event to date! Please save the date for our 4th Annual Wild & Scenic Film Festival and silent auction on Friday, March 8th, 2013.
- Launched a new and improved website at www.gcwolfrecovery.org where you can sign up automatically for our action e-mail list, see photos of our adventures, read wolf news from our region, purchase unique items in our Lobo Marketplace, and donate securely online!
- Met with Grand Canyon National Park superintendent, David Uberuaga, and park staff to discuss wolf recovery and National Park Service participation in recovery planning.



- Coordinated over 100 volunteers to participate in the Paseo del Lobo relay hike! The Paseo del Lobo campaign was featured on the websites, e-newsletters, and facebook pages of Mexicanwolves.org, the National WolfWatcher Coalition, and Defenders of Wildlife.
- Our staff was selected to attend an environmental leadership training program.
- Conducted wolf outreach tables at the Flagstaff Earth Day Celebration, Flagstaff Hullabaloo, events at the Orpheum Theater, and two weekends at the North Rim.
- Provided public presentations and discussions about wolves at Earth Hour for children in Flagstaff, Grand Canyon school, Alpine Community Center, White Mountain Nature Center, Canyon Point Campground, and the Shrine of the Ages Auditorium at the South Rim of the Grand Canyon.
- Supported the public in submitting comments on the Kaibab National Forest Draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Forest Plan Revisions.
- Aided wolf proponents in submitting over 125 signatures on a letter to the Regional Director of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service to request more releases of Mexican wolves into the wild.
- Assisted numerous volunteers to write comments and speak out for wolves at a public meeting held by the Mexican wolf Reintroduction Project field team and the Arizona Game and Fish Department Commission meeting.
